The Warden Norton conceals the safe, where he keeps the money he has stolen, with a framed bible quote which reads, *'His judgement cometh and that right soon'* (It means, God will judge your sins, when you arrive in heaven.)

- 1. Who leads the Warden to face his final judgement?
- 2. The Warden chooses suicide, instead of facing judgement from the law. Why does he choose this option, rather than wait in hope of defending himself? (Consider the Warden's religious views.)

The Warden and Andy have their first face to face encounter when the Warden is searching his cell for contraband. They exchange bible quotes.

Andy: Watch ye, therefore, for ye know not when the master of the house cometh. **Norton:** But I prefer: but I am the light of the world. Ye that followeth me shall have the light of life.

The two characters are exchanging quotes from the bible, but really Andy and the Warden are having an argument and referring to each other.

- 1. Andy's quote mentions a 'master' which is a reference to God. However, what other 'master' is Andy warning the Warden of?
- 2. Why should the Warden be careful and 'watch' for when the 'master' comes?
- 3. Norton's quote is a quote that was spoken by God himself. So the 'l' is supposed to refer to God. In this case though, who is the 'l' that Norton is referring to?
- 4. What does Norton mean when he instructs Andy to 'followeth (follow) me'?
- 5. What is the 'light of life' that Norton is offering Andy?
